"EXTRACT FROM OFFICIAL ORDERS."

The allowances for Clothing for Cavalry, shall be \$3 50 per month. Each Officer, Non-commissioned Officer, Private, and Musician, shall furnish his own Horse and Horse Equipments. [Equipments and Clothing can be furnished for \$50] In case the Horse is lost in action, the Government pays for same 50 Cents a day is allowed for use of Horse.

Some good FARRIERS and BLACKSMITHS, wanted for the above Regiment, PAY EXTRA.

This is the only Cavalry Regiment accepted by the United States Government for immediate Service, and to serve during the War.
